

## FIRING LINE SAFETY RULES FOR 100 and 300 yard ranges

- When a cease fire is called, all firearms on the benches must be cleared which means actions open, magazine removed, and chamber flag installed or bolt removed to prove the chamber is clear
- Members **MUST** then move behind the **YELLOW** line when members are down range posting targets or picking brass in front of the concrete pad
- Activate the **RED** light on the 100 yard range to indicate the range is **COLD**
- During a cease fire there **MUST NOT** be any handling of firearms on the shooting benches or moving firearms to and from the benches and vehicles. This includes adjusting scopes.
- “**PERSON DOWN RANGE**” sign **MUST** be placed by the cone to indicate shooters are posting/removing targets or in front of pad picking brass

### RANGE CONDITIONS TO GO **HOT**

- Once all personnel have returned to the concrete pad from posting/removing targets **and** the range is visually inspected and deemed clear and safe
- Return the “**PERSON DOWN RANGE**” sign to the bench area and switch off the **RED** light on the 100 yard range.
- **ONLY** then can the firing line go **HOT** and shooting resume.
